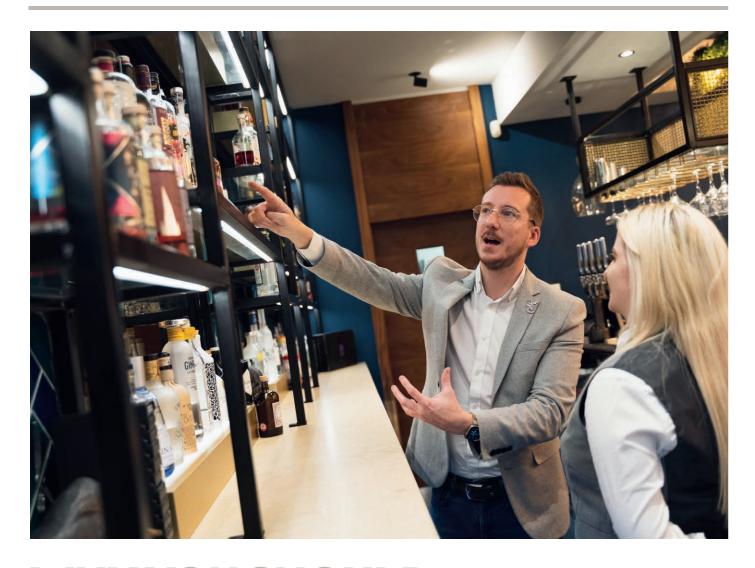
The Charter is the idea of Richard Palmer, Managing Director of the Devonshire Hotels and Restaurants Group and Neil Fischer, Managing Director of the Fischer's Group. It follows best practice and is inspired by the People 1st Hospitality Commitment and the 2020 Hoteliers' Charter which was founded by Sally Beck, General Manager of the Royal Lancaster Hotel London, and designed to dispel the myth that working in hotels meant 'long hours for little pay'.

SUPPORT

The development of a Peak District & Derbyshire Hospitality Charter has attracted strong support from Local Authorities, Colleges, Universities and training providers and other private sector businesses including Casa Hotel and Peak Edge Hotel, The Bakewell Bakery, Bluebell Dairy and Tickled Trout. This Charter will provide a platform for businesses to have regular conversations about working within the sector, with the aim to develop an Influencer Group.



OBJECTIVES OF THE CHARTER **EDUCATE** DISPEL THE CURRENT REPUTATION OF 'LONG HOURS FOR LITTLE PAY' EMPLOYMENT Educate the future people who will work in the hospitality sector by promoting the industry in schools, reaching children when they are making their career choices as well as parents and careers advisers. Educate the employment agencies in charge of advertising future job vacancies (many currently have a poor understanding of the careers available). Work in partnership with colleges and universities to design the right courses, to ensure they meet current demands and needs of hospitality businesses. OUR PROMISE

THIS CHARTER SETS OUT THE FOLLOWING COMMITMENTS, WITH A LONG-TERM OBJECTIVE TO CREATE A SET OF ATTRACTIVE CAREER CHOICES, PROVIDING PEOPLE WITH A POSITIVE WORKING EXPERIENCE, AND A SOLUTION TO THE CURRENT SECTOR RECRUITMENT CRISIS.

- Commit to developing team members through training, apprenticeships, coaching and mentoring, positioning hospitality roles as careers, not just jobs.
- Support best practice models demonstrated by the 'People 1st Hospitality Commitment' to respect work/life balance and striking the right working hours for businesses open 7 days per week.
- Commit to paying a competitive salary, ending perceptions of the sector as low paid and provide the right training environment for people to develop their careers into leadership and management roles.
- Work with training providers to design the right training programmes that are ambitious

- and are attractive to people thinking about working in the sector.
- Recruit where you can from your locality, advocate diversity, inclusion and equality, and remove barriers and challenging attitudes to disability.
- Take full care of your employee's mental health and well-being, both in and out of the workplace.
- Create a positive working environment and culture for people to learn, making employees part of the decision-making process.
- Develop clear pathways for progression for both existing staff as well as new recruits.

- Provide benefits to your employees, for example 'eat on us', offer bonuses at peak times of the year, introduce social gatherings that will nurture positive team working.
- Provide a platform and a voice for the sector, and continually work together to improve the working environment offering a long-term solution for both recruitment and staff retention.
- Get involved with job fairs and opportunities to promote the sector and create an army of industry champions for the Peak District and Derbyshire.
- Support schools/college Career Practitioners with the offer of industry group talks on a regular basis.
