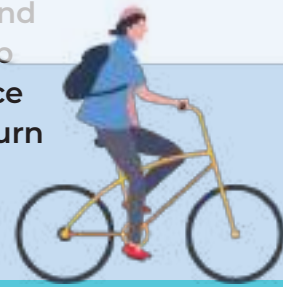

Discover a long-distance walking and cycling route that runs through over 42 miles of spectacular landscapes, charming towns and villages, and stunning cultural sites in Derbyshire and the Peak District. The White Peak Loop offers an outstanding visitor experience where you can really feel alive and return home refreshed, inspired and with memories to last a lifetime.



## Bike Hire Along The Loop

Bike and e-bike hire is available along the White Peak Loop at Hassop Station (near Bakewell on the Monsal Trail), Parsley Hay (between Buxton and Ashbourne) and Middleton Top Visitor Centre (near Wirksworth), providing easy access to scenic, traffic-free cycling routes. All offer a range of bikes, including electric and accessible options. Bike hire is typically on a first-come, first-served basis, and ID is required.

## Getting Here

The White Peak Loop can be accessed anywhere along the route, but good starting points are Bakewell, Matlock and Matlock Bath. Trains run to Buxton, Cromford, Matlock and Matlock Bath, providing easy access to the Loop. Regular buses also serve the towns of Bakewell, Matlock, Ashbourne, Wirksworth and Buxton along the route. Car parks are highlighted on the map, but we recommend using public transport where possible.

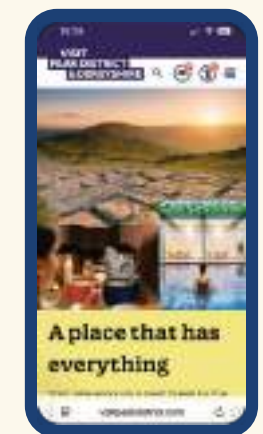
